





assistance, inter-library loan facilities and book binding.





Circulation Services at JKML and Campus Libraries

Circulation services are rendered in the Jomo Kenyatta Memorial Library and in each campus library.

Did You Know?

- That you can obtain information from other libraries through inter library loan? Approach librarians in respective libraries for this service. There is no single library that can have all the information resources. Our library co-operates with other libraries. We share various information sources. See the list of co-operating library at the end of the newsletter.
- That books are easily loaned to students for two weeks and that the loan is renewable in our library.
- That books are reserved for you on request at the issue desk.
- For learning purposes, parts of articles from magazines, reference books can be photo-copied for your use at a subsidized cost without infringing copyright rules.
- That suggestions may be channelled through library staff or dropped in the suggestions box. Our staff are willing to talk to you and solve your problems where possible. Approach them.
- That books on high demand, like recommended materials on reading lists, are placed in the reserve collection. They are placed at the request of academic staff. They are loaned to students for a limited period to facilitate sharing of the materials among other students. Materials in this collection may leave the library for overnight use only. They are, therefore, readily available at request.

We offer the following services:

- Compile bibliographies on request on specialised topics.
- Carry out literature search on specified topics on request.
- Offer user-services or education on how to use the catalogue.

The Law of the Sea Documentation Centre

The centre is part of the co-operation project between Ghent and Nairobi Universities and from this year the University of Dar-es-salaam is included. The aim of the Centre is to promote research in the area of law of the sea, ocean management and marine policy. There is a stock of about 300 documents which are entered both in the public catalogue and in a database. At present there are three Ph.D. students on the project from the Faculty of Law. Other postgraduate students also use the literature too. There is one computer with a CD-ROM drive with the following data bases installed: Science and Social Science Citation Index, Agris and Springer Publication Catalogue 1842-1994. A fax machine is also available and fax can be sent and received for a fee.

- Offer user-services on how to locate information (books, journals, audio-visual material, computer data etc)
- Offer user-services on how to use general reference and subject reference books.

Our reference collection consists of various information sources, including World of Learning, Guinness Book of Record, dictionaries, encyclopaedia, scholarship and grant manuals, newspaper indices, Who's Who in Kenya, Who's Who in Africa and Who's Who ? in Literature and university calendars from many countries.

Should you have difficulties in locating and using some of the resources, consult the Reference Librarian, at JKML or respective librarians in each sub-library.


The Reference Librarian will have time to discuss your information needs in confidence. He maintains good public relations. Approach him for help whenever necessary.

The University of Nairobi Library Computer Unit

Using Information Technology to Improve Library Services to Users

The Computer Section of the University Library was established in 1988 in response to the challenge brought about by the emerging use of computer technology in libraries to improve library services to users. Since its establishment, the Computer Unit has strived to improve library services to users through computerisation of popular data-bases. Among the databases computerised are:

- The Union List of periodicals consisting of a

list of periodicals available in Kenyan libraries.

- Theses database, a listing of all theses within the University of Nairobi Library System.
- Law Dissertations, a list of law dissertations in the Faculty of Law.
- IDS Database, a list of research papers such as occasional and

working papers produced by the Institute for Development Studies researchers

- Books on Order, a list of books ordered through the World Bank Project.
- Short Loan Database a list of all the holdings of the reserve collection.

Apart from these in-house databases, the Computer Unit also offers literature search services based on CD-ROM technology. The Unit has the following CD-ROM databases:

- Social Science Citation Index
- Science Citation Index
- The Engineering Citation Database

The Unit can carry out a search on a particular topic and compile a bibliography for any authorised library user on request. Computer services offered by the Unit have proved to be very popular among our users. Plans are underway to strengthen the computer

facilities of the Unit to facilitate efficient dissemination of information.

The Medical Library

The College of Health Sciences Medical Library is situated in the premises of Kenyatta National Hospital. The library is equipped with medical books, journals and computer diskettes. It disseminates information to doctors undergraduate and post - graduate students.

During the past year the library has concentrated efforts on improving its information dissemination capabilities. To this end, with the cooperation of HealthNet, the library has been able to offer the following services:

- **E-MAIL:** In addition to housing HealthNet node, the Medical Library has two points on the HealthNet system. One point is used for E-mail communication and serves as a guest "Post Box" to members of the college who wish to avail themselves of the service.
- **MEDINFO:** It serves as a dissemination point for literature enquiries for all point users on the HealthNet system, of which there are currently 150. It has CD-ROM capabilities while the library provides literature searches using the MEDLINE and COMPACT AIDS data-bases on CD-ROM.

Access to POPLINE will be provided in the near future. In addition to these data-bases, the library has a number of full text journals on CD-ROM, for example, *Lancet* and *Paediatrics*.

- **Bitnis:** Provides E-mail access to the data bases of the National Library of Medicine, USA (NLM). This service is mostly used to search NLM data-bases other than MEDICINE, for example, CANCERLIT, AIDSLINE, TOXLINE etc. Searches are sent as E-mail messages and the search results are received in the same manner. The turn-around time is less than 24 hours.
- **Kenya Medical Abstracts:** The data base contains reference to medical and health-related literature on Kenya since 1980. About 50% of the entries contain abstracts.

New Publications

The library continues to strengthen its collection through the Acquisition Section. Recently, the Ministry of Education through the Universities Investment Project has helped the library up-date its collection greatly. In phase I of World Bank Assistance Project the library acquired 6,752 titles which gave us 16,299 volumes. In Phase II we purchased 12,000 titles which gave us about 36,000 volumes. In addition we are now able to acquire information in form of CD-ROM data-bases.

We are very grateful to university administration for being supportive in our endeavour to up-date our library collection. We also thank the Ministry of Education and the World Bank for their financial assistance.
